We stock a wide range of edible and ornamental bananas as well as other subtropical plants.
There are limited supplies of Hondurian hybrids due to their popularity as a commercial variety. Please contact us if you want to place a back order.

Bananas are gross feeders during the growing season and generally require the following:

- Frost free – hardier once established and some types can withstand a limited number of frosts
- Warm sunny position with good drainage is best
- Sheltered from the wind
- Slopes of 15 degrees or less to enable safe harvesting. Greater slopes can be terraced.

Plants considered suitable for planting into greenhouse: Dwarf Cavendish, Grande naine, Rajapuri and the Cavendish subtype known as "Double" or "Mahoi".

All other stock is recommended for planting outside from November until February, except in frost free areas where planting can safely be achieved in other months.

In New Zealand it is recommended for indoor cultivation in covered structures. The fruit are green, often weigh 2-4kg and covered in tiny soft short spines. Chocolate Sapote (Diospyros digyna)	Diospyros nigra, the black sapote, is an evergreen species of persimmon native to Mexico, Central America, and Colombia. Common names include chocolate pudding fruit, black soapapple and zapote prieto. It can grow up to 25 m in height with trunk diameter of up to 45 cm. It has a rounded crown, black bark, and glossy, dark green leaves. Its fruit is consumed raw when fully ripe and/or cooked. Its flesh is dark chocolate brown to black in colour but somewhat sweet and rich in flavour. Immature fruits can also be eaten as a vegetable when boiled.
