Bananas are gross feeders during the growing season and generally require the following:

- Frost free hardier once establish and some types can withstand a limited number of frosts.
- Warm sunny position with good drainage is best.
- Sheltered from the wind.
- Slopes of 15 degrees or less.

Plants considered suitable for planting into greenhouse: Dwarf Cavendish, Raja Puri, Grande naine, & Double. All other stock recommended for planting from November until February; except in areas frost free where planting can safely be achieved.

Banana grades measured from base of pot to top leaf tip:

Small: upto 0.5m in height in 17 cm pots Medium: 0.5 – 1.0m height in 23 cm pots Large: 1.0m – 1.5m height in 28cm pots

XL 1.5m height or greater

Specimen potted banana up to 2.5m

Stems, are bare rooted plants and available from October/Nov
